Wakefield – The Gafney Library Literacy Program will continue its Adult Basic Ed/GED Program straight through the summer months. Because of space constraints at the library in Sanbornville, the program is located in The Greater Wakefield Resource Center in Union on Route 125 in the form of a weekly drop in center each Wednesday from 3:00 to 7:00 p.m. If you are in need of help earning a GED, stop in any time between those hours and meet with Dot Currier, Sharon Norby, Lisa Kimball and Career Counselor Rosemary Stewart, program staff members.

Been a long time since you've studied? A little worried about how you might do? Rest assured, Dot will put you at ease and determine a course of study to get you through at your own speed. Trouble reading and writing? Sharon has the expertise to get you going in no time. Having a hard time with math? Lisa has helped many students overcome that "math block" and pass the test successfully. All study materials, tutoring and pretests are provided free of charge. During your course of study Rosemary will touch base with you to see if you need to create a resume, hone your interviewing skills, search for a job, a college, internship or scholarship money.

Once you successfully pass a pretest, you will be ready to take the GED. The formal GED test is administered the second Thursday of each month. Pre-registration for the GED test is required by signing up at the drop in center during open hours prior to testing day. The cost of the GED test is \$65 or \$13.00 per test.

The Gafney Library in Sanbornville is open Tuesday and Thursday 1-7:30 p.m.; Wednesday and Friday 10-noon and Saturday 9-2. Brochures on the program are available there. For more information call library director Beryl Donovan at 522.3401.
